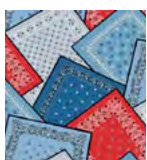

<b>(D)</b> Paw Print	Blue	1423-77	$\frac{5}{8}$ yard (0.57m)
<b>(E)</b> Border Stripe	Blue-Multi	1424-78	1 $\frac{7}{8}$ yards (1.71m)
<b>(F)</b> 10 in Blocks	Blue-Multi	1425-78	$\frac{2}{3}$ yard (0.61m)
<b>(G)</b> Check	Blue-White	1428-70	$\frac{1}{3}$ yard (0.30m)

## Cutting Instructions

### Notes:

- Please make sure to check [henryglassfabrics.net](http://henryglassfabrics.net) for pattern updates prior to starting the project.
- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

### Fabric A, cut:

- (1) 10" x WOF; sub-cut
- (2) 10" squares

### Fabric B, cut:

- (2) 11" x WOF; from each strip, sub-cut
  - (2) 11" squares and (3) 5¼" x 10" rectangles, then cut each 11" square diagonally in half twice to make (16) triangles
- (1) 5¼" x WOF; sub-cut
- (4) 5¼" x 10" rectangles

### Fabric C, cut:

- (1) 11" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (2) 11" squares, then cut each square diagonally in half twice to make (8) triangles
- (3) 5¼" x WOF; sub-cut
- (20) 5¼" squares

### Fabric D, cut:

- (3) 5¼" x WOF; sub-cut
- (6) 5¼" x 10" rectangles and (4) 5¼" squares

### Fabric E, cut:

- Fussy-cut (2) 7" x 57½" LOF
- Fussy-cut (2) 7" x 38½" LOF

### Fabric F, cut:

- Fussy-cut (6) 10" squares

### Fabric G, cut:

- (1) 7" x WOF; sub-cut
- (4) 7" squares

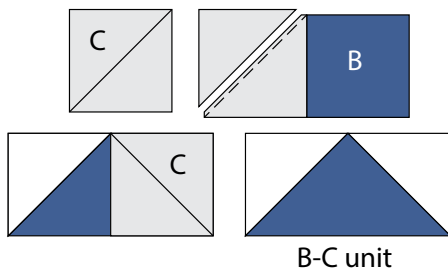
### Fabric H, cut:

- (1) 11" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (2) 11" squares, then cut each square diagonally in half twice to make (8) triangles
- (7) 2½" x WOF for the binding.

## Instructions

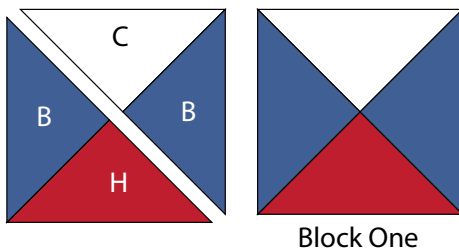
1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all **Fabric C** 5¼" squares. Place a marked square, right sides together, on the end of (1) **Fabric B** 5¼" x 10" rectangle. Stitch on the marked line, trim seam allowance to ¼" (0.64cm), and press corner open. Repeat with a second marked square on the opposite end to make (1) B-C unit measuring 5¼" x 10" (**Fig. 1**). Make a total of (10) B-C units.

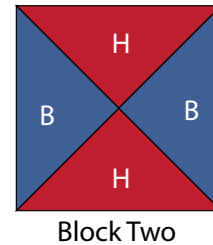
2. Lay out (1) each **Fabric C** and **Fabric H** 11" triangle, and (2) **Fabric B** 11" triangles. Sew into pairs and join the pairs to make Block One (**Fig. 2**). Square up to measure 10" square. Make a total of (6) Block One.

3. In the same way, use (2) each **Fabric B** and **Fabric H** 11" triangles to make (1) Block Two (**Fig. 3**).

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout (page 5) while assembling the quilt top.)

4. Noting block orientation, lay out (1) Block One, (2) **Fabric F** 10" squares and (2) B-C units into a row. Sew together to make Row 2, measuring 10" x 38½". Repeat to make Row 6. Sew together (1) Block Two, (2) **Fabric F** 10" squares and (2) B-C units to make Row 4.
5. Noting block orientation, lay out (2) Block One, (2) **Fabric D** 5¼" x 10" rectangles, and (1) **Fabric A** 10" square into a row. Sew together to make Row 3, measuring 10" x 38½". Repeat to make Row 5.
6. Lay out (2) B-C units, (2) **Fabric D** 5¼" squares, and (1) **Fabric D** 5¼" x 10" rectangle into a row. Sew together to make Row 1, measuring 5¼" x 38½". Repeat to make Row 7.
7. Sew the block rows together to complete the quilt center. Quilt center will measure 38½" x 57½".
8. Sew (1) **Fabric E** 7" x 57½" strip to opposite sides of the quilt center. Sew **Fabric G** 7" squares to opposite ends of the (2) **Fabric E** 7" x 38½" strips, and then sew to both the top and bottom.

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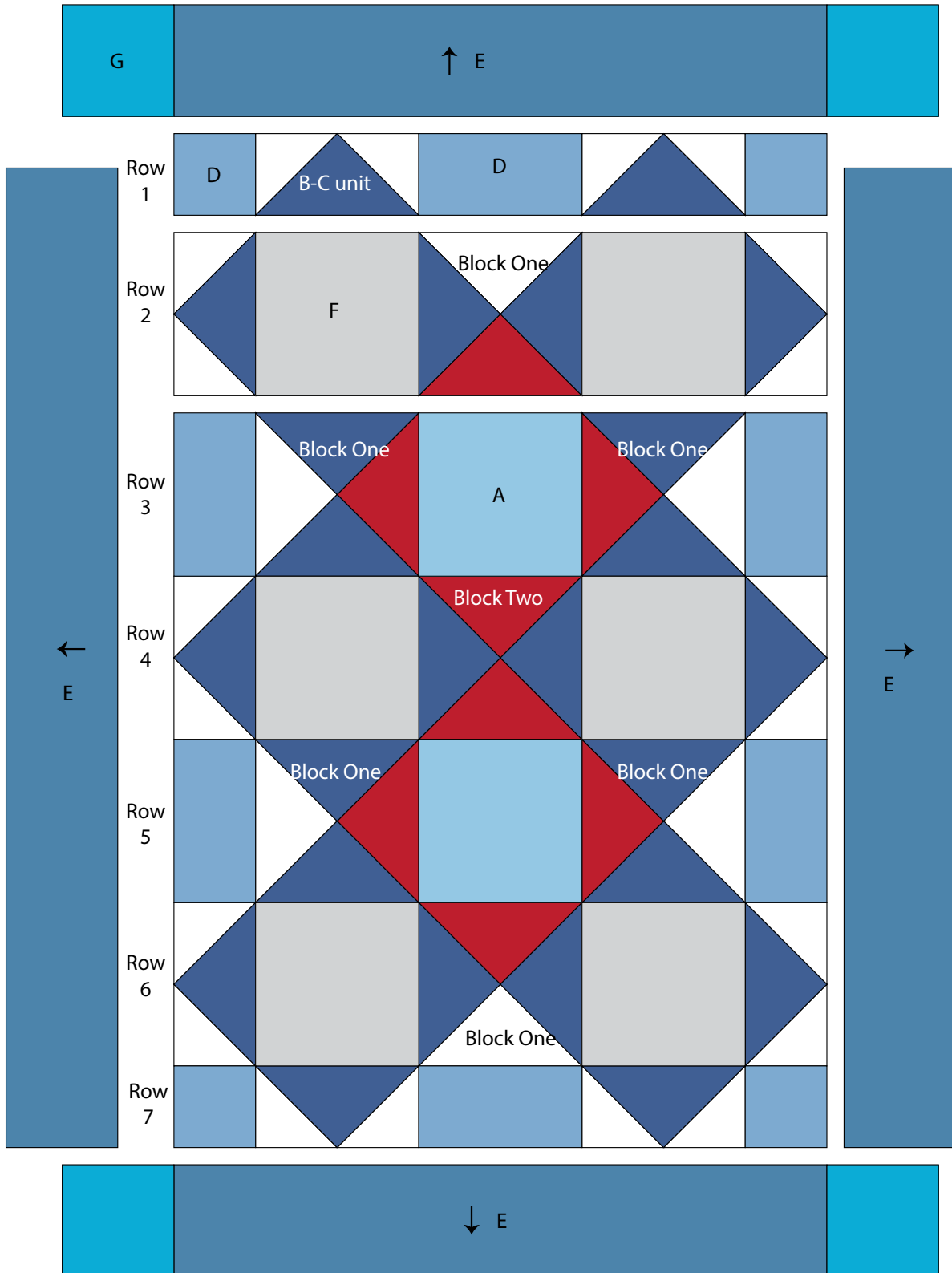
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## Finishing

9. Sew together the (7) 2½" x WOF **Fabric H** binding strips end to end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
10. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to ¼" (0.64) and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
11. Turn the binding to the back of the quilt and hand or machine stitch in place.
