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

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Folio Basics - Spruce (A), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2" squares.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (20) 1 ½" squares.

#### From the Packed Pink Flowers - Pink (B), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 ½" squares.
- (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 2" x 2 ½" strips.

#### From the Butterflies and Flowers - Light Blue (C), cut:

- (3) 2 3/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 3/8" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 2" squares.
- (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2" x 4 ½" strips.
- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (160) 1 ½" squares.

#### From the Folio Basics - Forest (D), cut:

- (3) 2 3/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 3/8" squares.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2" squares.

#### From the Leaves and Butterflies - White/Multi (E), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 4 ½" squares.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2" squares.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 50 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 42 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

#### From the Floral - Multi (F), cut:

• (3) 5 %" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 5 %" squares.

#### From the Folio Basics - Pigment White (G), cut:

• (3) 5 \%" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 5 \%" squares.

#### From the Folio Basics - Off White (H), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 52 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 45 ½" strips.

#### From the Border Stripe - Blue/Multi (I), cut:

- (2) 8 ½" x 55 ½" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 8 ½" x 45 ½" LOF strips.

#### From the Tossed Mushrooms - Blue/Multi (J), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 4 ½" squares.

#### From the Packed Little Flowers - Red (K), cut:

• (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Tossed Ladybug - White/Red (Backing), cut:

• (2) 69" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 69" x 79" back.

#### **Block Assembly**

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a '4' seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Place (1) 2" Fabric A square on the bottom right corner of (1) 2 ½" Fabric B square, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (20) Unit 1 squares total.

2. Place (1) 1 ½" Fabric A square on the bottom left corner of (1) 2 ½" Fabric B square, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (20) Unit 2 squares total.





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
3. Refer to Figure 5 and sew together (2) Unit 1 squares and (2) Unit 2 squares into a 2 x 2 matrix to make (1) 4 ½" Unit 3 square. Repeat to make (10) Unit 3 squares total.



4. Place (1) 2 3/8" Fabric D square on top of (1) 2 3/8" Fabric C square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 6). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 6). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 7) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2" square to make (2) Unit 4 squares (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (80) Unit 4 squares total.



5. Sew (1) 2" Fabric C square to the left side of (1) Unit 4 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to the left side of (1) 2" Fabric D square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 3 ½" Unit 5 square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (40) Unit 5 squares total.



6. Place (1) 1 ½" Fabric C square on the top left corner of (1) 2 ½" x 2" Fabric B strip, right sides together (Fig. 10). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 10). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 11).









- 7. Follow Figure 12 for the seam direction to add a 1 ½" Fabric C square to the upper right corner of the 2 ½" x 2" Fabric B strip to make (1) Unit 6 rectangle (Fig. 14).
- 8. Repeat Steps 6-7 to make (80) Unit 6 rectangles total.




9. Sew (1) Unit 6 rectangles together end to end. Sew (1) 2" x 4 ½" Fabric C strip to the top of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make (1) 4 ½" x 3 ½" Unit 7 rectangle (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (40) Unit 7 rectangles total.



10. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to each end of (1) Unit 7 rectangle to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 7 rectangle to each side of (1) Unit 3 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 10 ½" Block One square (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (10) Block One squares total.



11. Place (1) 5 %" Fabric F square on top of (1) 5 %" Fabric G square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 16). Sew ¼" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 16). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 17) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 5 ½" square to make (2) Unit 8 squares (Fig. 18). Repeat to make (40) Unit 8 squares total.



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12. Place (1) 2" Fabric C square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 8 square, right sides together (Fig. 19). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 19). Flip open the triangle formed and press (. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam Fig. 20).





- 13. Follow Figure 21 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric E square to the lower right corner of the Unit 8 square to make (1) Unit 9 square (Fig. 22).
- 14. Repeat Steps 12-13 to make (40) Unit 9 squares total.








15. Refer to Figure 23 and sew together (4) Unit 9 squares into a 2 x 2 matrix to make (1) 10 ½" Block Two square (Fig. 23). Repeat to make (10) Block Two squares total.




- 16. Sew together (2) Block One squares and (2) Block Two squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 24). Repeat to make Row Three and Row Five.
- 17. Sew together (2) Block Two squares and (2) Block One squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 24). Repeat to make Row Four.
- 18. Sew together the (5) pieced Rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from the top to the bottom, to make the 40 ½" x 50 ½" Center Block (Fig. 24).




19. Sew 4 ½" Fabric J square to the left side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric E square to make the top row. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric E square to the left side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric J square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 8 1/2" Unit 10 square (Fig. 25). Repeat to make (4) Unit 10 squares total.



20. Sew (1) Unit 10 square to each end of (1) 8 ½" x 45 ½" Fabric I strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 26).



21. Sew (1) Unit 10 square to each end of (1) 8 ½" x 45 ½" Fabric I strip to make the Bottom Border (Fig. 27).



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#### **Quilt Top Assembly**

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 22. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 23. Sew (1) 2" x 52 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 45 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 24. Sew (1) 8 ½" x 55 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block.

- 25. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 26. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 27. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric K strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 28. Bind as desired.
