Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Panel Gardening Snowmen - Blue (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 40 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel

From the Snowflakes - Blue (B), cut:

- (2) 3 ½" x 26 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips.

From the Seed Packets - Light Blue (C), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 5 ½" x 8" strips.

From the Rosemary Basic - Blue (D), cut:

- (1) 5 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 5 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (8) 5 ⅞" triangles.
- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 5 ½" squares.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 55 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 37 ½" WOF strips.

From the Tossed Herbs and Plaid - Yellow/Tan (E), cut:

- (2) 6 ¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (7) 6 ¼" squares and (4) 5 ⅞" squares. Cut the 6 ¼" squares across both diagonals to make (28) 6 ¼" triangles.

From the Folio Basics - Silver (F), cut:

- (1) 6 ¼" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (5) 6 ¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (20) 6 ¼" triangles.
- (1) 5 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 5 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (12) 5 ⅞" triangles.
- (1) 5 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 5 ⅞" squares.

From the Mini Snowflakes Toss - Light Blue (G), cut:

- (1) 6 ¼" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 ¼" squares and (2) 5 ⅞" squares. Cut the 6 ¼" squares across both diagonals to make (8) 6 ¼" triangles.

From the Mini Rosemary Basic - Red (H), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 57 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Mini Rosemary Basic - Green (I), cut:

- (1) 5 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 5 ⅞" squares. Cut (4) of the squares across (1) diagonal to make (8) 5 ⅞" triangles.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 70 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 53 ½" strips.

From the Border Stripe - Blue (J), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x 89" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 6 ½" x 69" LOF strips.

From the Gardening Novelty - Light Blue (K), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 5 ½" x 20 ½" WOF strips.

From the Gardening Snowmen Allover - Light Blue (Backing), cut:

- (2) 93" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 73" x 93" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2 ½" X 40 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 26 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 25 ½" x 45 ½".**

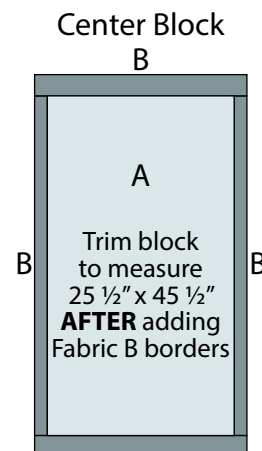

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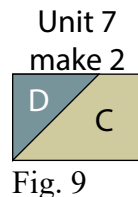
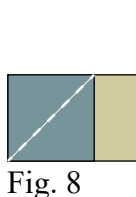
2. Sew together (1) 6 ¼" Fabric E triangle and (1) 6 ¼" Fabric F triangle along short sides. Sew (1) 5 ⅞" Fabric D triangle to the long side of the newly sewn triangle to make (1) 5 ½" Unit 1 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (4) Unit 1 squares total.



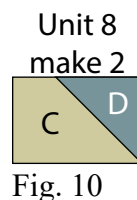
3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figures 3-7 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Unit 2 squares, (4) Unit 3 squares, (4) Unit 4 squares, (2) Unit 5 squares and (4) Unit 6 squares.



4. Place (1) 5 ½" Fabric D square on the left side of (1) 5 ½" x 8" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 9). Repeat to make a second Unit 7 strip.



5. Place (1) 5 ½" Fabric D square on the right side of (1) 5 ½" x 8" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 10). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 10). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 8 strip (Fig. 10). Repeat to make a second Unit 8 strip.



6. Sew together (1) 5 ½" x 8" Fabric C strip, (1) Unit 1 square, (1) Unit 2 square, (1) Unit 3 square, (1) Unit 4 square, (1) Unit 5 square and (1) Unit 6 square and (1) 5 ½" x 8" Fabric C strip, end to end and in that order from top to bottom, to make the Inner Left Side Border (Fig. 11).

8. Sew together (1) Unit 7 strip, (1) Unit 1 square, (1) Unit 4 square, (1) Unit 3 square, (1) Unit 6 square and (1) Unit 8 strip, end to end and in that order from left to right, to make the Inner Top Border (Fig. 13).

9. Repeat Step 8 and refer to Figure 14 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Inner Bottom Border.

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10. Place (1) $5\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric E square on top of (1) $5\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric F square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 15). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 15). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 16) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $5\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 9 squares (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (8) Unit 9 squares total.

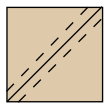

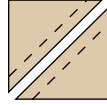

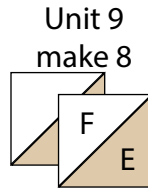

11. Repeat Step 10 and refer to Figure 18 for fabric identification and placement to make (4) Unit 10 squares.

12. Sew (1) $6\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric E triangle and (1) $6\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric F triangle together along short sides. Sew (1) $5\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric I triangle to the long side of the newly sewn triangle to make (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 11 square (Fig. 19). Repeat to make (4) Unit 11 squares total.

13. Repeat Step 12 and refer to Figure 20 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (4) Unit 12 squares.

14. Sew (1) Unit 9 square, Unit 11 square, (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K strip, (1) Unit 12 square and (1) Unit 9 square together end to end and in that order from top to bottom to make the Outer Left Side Border (Fig. 21).

15. Repeat Step 14 and refer to Figure 22 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Outer Right Side Border.

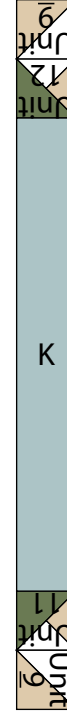

16. Sew together (1) Unit 10 square, (1) Unit 9 square, (1) Unit 12 square, (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $20\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K strip, (1) Unit 11 square, (1) Unit 9 square and (1) Unit 10 square, end to end and in that order from left to right, to make Outer Top Border (Fig. 23).

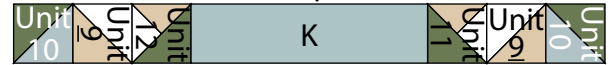

17. Repeat Step 16 and refer to Figure 24 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Outer Bottom Border.

Outer Bottom Border

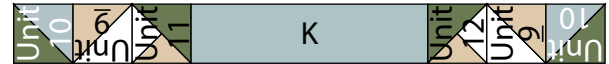

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Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

18. Sew the Inner Left Side Border and the Inner Right Side Border to the left and right sides of the Center Block.

19. Sew the Inner Top Border and Inner Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

20. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 55 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 37 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

21. Sew (1) 2" x 57 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 40 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

22. Sew the Outer Left Side Border and the Outer Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

23. Sew the Outer Top Border and Outer Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

24. Sew (1) 2" x 70 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 53 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

25. Center (1) 6 ½" x 89" Fabric J strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

26. Repeat Step 25 to sew (1) 6 ½" x 69" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 25).

27. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 25), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

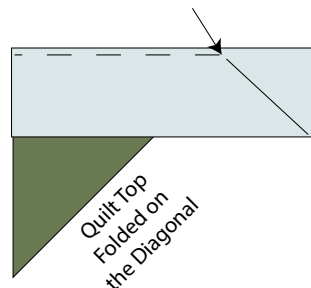
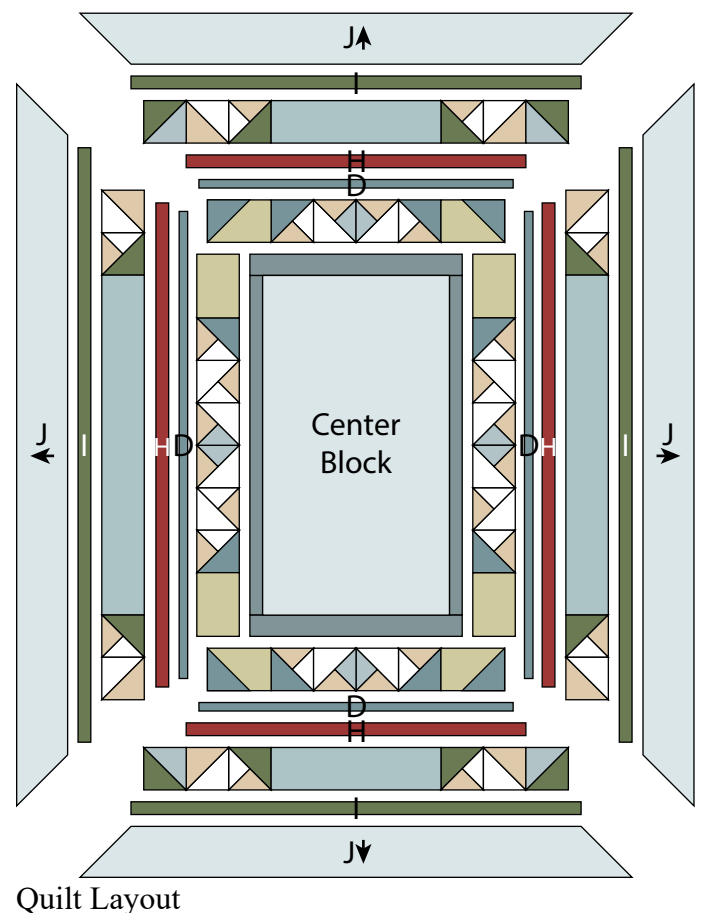

28. Layer and quilt as desired.

29. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

30. Bind as desired.
