¼ yard	Tossed Giraffes - White (A)	F1593-4
¼ yard	Stars - Orange (B)	F1594-33
⅜ yard	Geometric Lattice - Blue (C)	F1590-11
⅔ yard	Fluffy Solids - Solid White (D)	Fluffy Solid White
¼ yard	Allover Characters - White/Multi (E)	F1589-43
¾ yard	Fluffy Solids - Solid Red (F)	Fluffy Solid Red*
⅞ yard	Stars - Blue (G)	F1594-11
½ yard	Characters in Hexies - White/Multi (H)	F1595-13
¼ yard	Bees - Blue (I)	F1591-11
¼ yard	Fluffy Solids - Apple Green (J)	Fluffy Solid Apple Green
¼ yard	Tossed Puppies - Blue (K)	F1592-11
¼ yard	Allover Characters - Blue (L)	F1589-11

Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From Tossed Giraffes - White (A), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 ½" squares.

From Stars - Orange (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 6 ½" strips.

From Geometric Lattice - Blue (C), cut:

- (1) 3 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 3 ⅞" squares.
- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 ½" squares.

From Fluffy - Solid White (D), cut:

- (1) 3 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 3 ⅞" squares.
- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 6 ½" strips.

From Allover Characters - White/Multi (E), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 ½" squares.

From Fluffy - Solid Red (F), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 3 ½" squares.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 6 ½" strips.
- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From Stars - Blue (G), cut:

- (4) 4 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 3 ½" squares.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 6 ½" strips.

From Characters in Hexies - White/Multi (H):

- Fussy cut (2) 6 ½" squares, each centered on a hexi.

From Bees - Blue (I), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 6 ½" strips.

From Fluffy - Apple Green (J), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3 ½" squares.

From Tossed Puppies - Blue (K), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6 ½" squares.

From Allover Characters - Blue (L), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 ½" squares.

From Dots with Characters - Multi (M), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (1) 6 ½" square and (4) 4 ½" squares.

From Geometric Lattice - Green (N), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 36 ½" WOF strips.

From Stars - Orange (Backing), cut:

- (2) 56" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 56" x 56" back.

Block Assembly

1. Place (1) 3 ⅞" Fabric C square on top of (1) 3 ⅞" Fabric D square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Sew ¼" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the blocks to measure 3 ½" square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 3). *Note: The arrow in Figure 3 denotes fabric print direction.*

2. Place (1) 3 ⅞" Fabric C square on top of (1) 3 ⅞" Fabric D square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Sew ¼" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 4). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 5) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the blocks to measure 3 ½" square to make (2) Unit 2 squares (Fig. 6). The arrow in Figure 6 denotes fabric print direction.

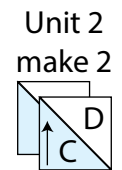
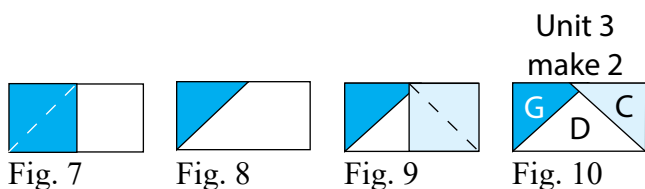

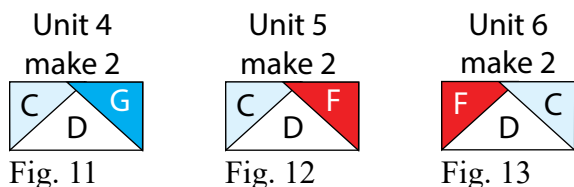
3. Place (1) 3 1/2" Fabric G square on the left side of (1) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 8). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance.

4. Place (1) 3 1/2" Fabric C square on the right side of the 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 10).

5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make a second Unit 3 strip.

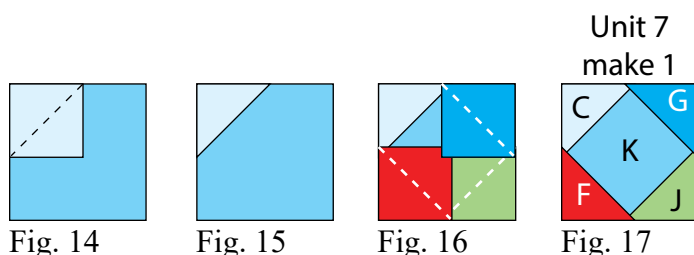


6. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figures 11-13 for fabric identification, location and seam direction to make (2) Unit 4 strips, (2) Unit 5 strips and (2) Unit 6 strips.



7. Place (1) 3 1/2" Fabric C square on the top left corner of (1) 6 1/2" Fabric K square, right sides together (Fig. 14). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 14). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 15). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam.

8. Follow Figure 16 for the seam direction to add a 3 1/2" Fabric G square to the upper right corner, a 3 1/2" Fabric F square to the lower left corner and (1) 3 1/2" Fabric J square to the lower right corner of the 6 1/2" Fabric K square to make (1) Unit 7 square (Fig. 4).



9. Repeat Steps 7-8 and refer to Figures 18-20 for fabric identification, location and seam direction to make (1) Unit 8 square, (1) Unit 9 square and (1) Unit 10 square.

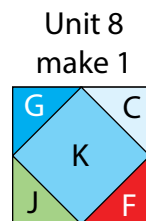

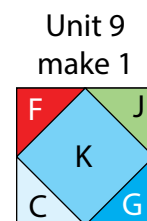

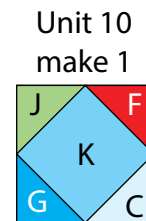

10. Sew (1) 2" x 6 1/2" Fabric D strip to the top of (1) 2" x 6 1/2" Fabric B strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 11 strip (Fig. 21). Repeat to make (4) Unit 11 strips total.

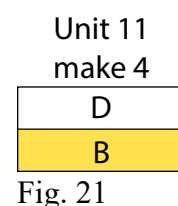

11. Repeat Step 10 and refer to Figures 22-24 for fabric identification and location to make (2) Unit 12 strips, (4) Unit 13 strips and (2) Unit 14 strips.

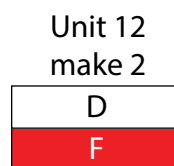

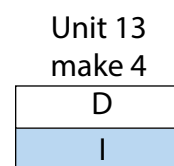

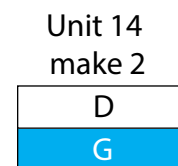

12. Sew (1) 2" x 6 1/2" Fabric F strip to the bottom of (1) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric D strip lengthwise. Sew (1) 2" x 6 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top of the Fabric D strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 15 strip (Fig. 25). Repeat to make a second Unit 15 strip.

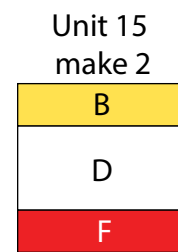

13. Repeat Step 12 and refer to Figures 26-28 for fabric identification and location to make (4) Unit 16 strips, (4) Unit 17 strips and (2) Unit 18 strips.

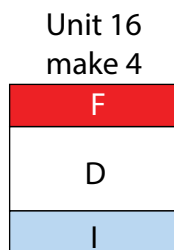

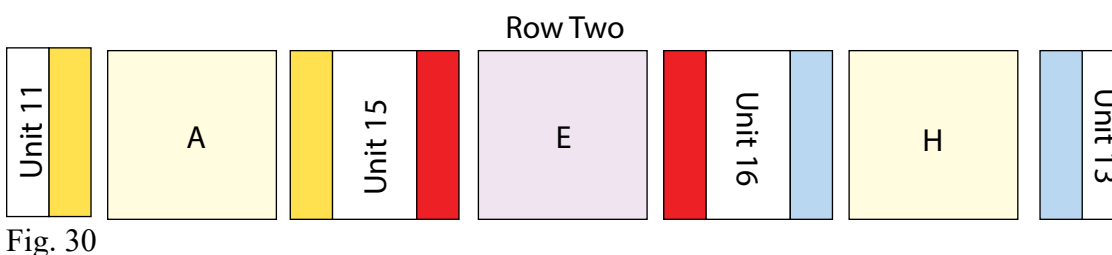
Quilt Top Assembly

Pay attention to the unit orientations while assembling the rows and follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.

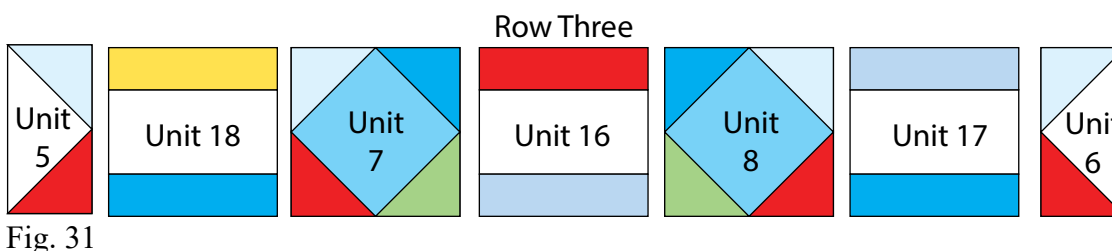
14. Sew (1) Unit 1 square, (1) Unit 11 strip, (1) Unit 3 strip, (1) Unit 12 strip, (1) Unit 4 strip, (1) Unit 13 strip and (1) Unit 2 square together end to end and in that order to make Row One (Fig. 29).



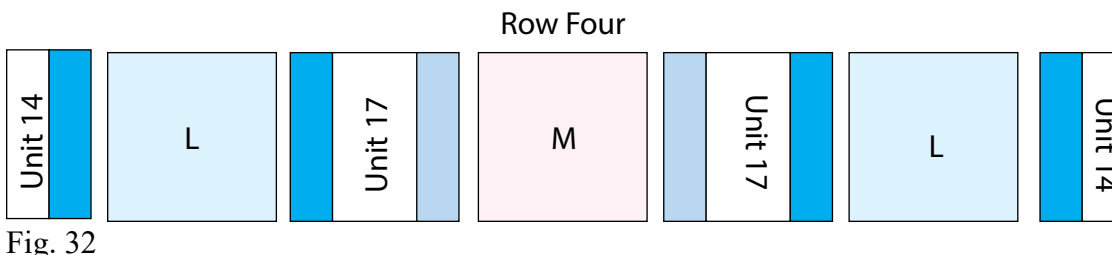
15. Sew (1) Unit 11 strip, (1) 6 1/2" Fabric A square, (1) Unit 15 strip, (1) 6 1/2" Fabric E square, (1) Unit 16 strip, (1) 6 1/2" Fabric H square and (1) Unit 13 strip together in that order to make Row Two (Fig. 30).



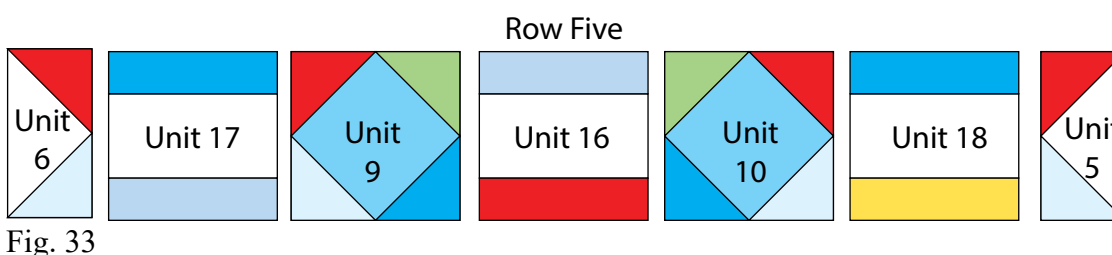
16. Sew (1) Unit 5 strip, (1) Unit 18 strip, (1) Unit 7 square, (1) Unit 16 strip, (1) Unit 8 square, (1) Unit 17 strip and (1) Unit 6 strip together in that order to make Row Three (Fig. 31).



17. Sew (1) Unit 14 strip, (1) 6 1/2" Fabric L square, (1) Unit 17 strip, (1) 6 1/2" Fabric M square, (1) Unit 17 strip, (1) 6 1/2" Fabric L square and (1) Unit 14 strip together in that order to make Row Four (Fig. 32).



18. Sew (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) Unit 17 strip, (1) Unit 9 square, (1) Unit 16 strip, (1) Unit 10 square, (1) Unit 18 strip and (1) Unit 5 strip together in that order to make Row Five (Fig. 33).



19. Sew (1) Unit 13 strip, (1) 6 ½" Fabric H square, (1) Unit 16 strip, (1) 6 ½" Fabric E square, (1) Unit 15 strip, (1) 6 ½" Fabric A square and (1) Unit 11 strip together in that order to make Row Six (Fig. 34 below).

20. Sew (1) Unit 2 square, (1) Unit 13 strip, (1) Unit 4 strip, (1) Unit 12 strip, (1) Unit 3 strip, (1) Unit 11 strip and (1) Unit 1 square together end to end and in that order to make Row Seven (Fig. 35 below).

21. Sew the (7) rows together in numerical order to make the quilt top.

22. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 36 ½" x Fabric N strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric N strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

23. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric M square to each end of (1) 4 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric G strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

24. Layer and quilt as desired.

25. Sew the (5) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

26. Bind as desired.

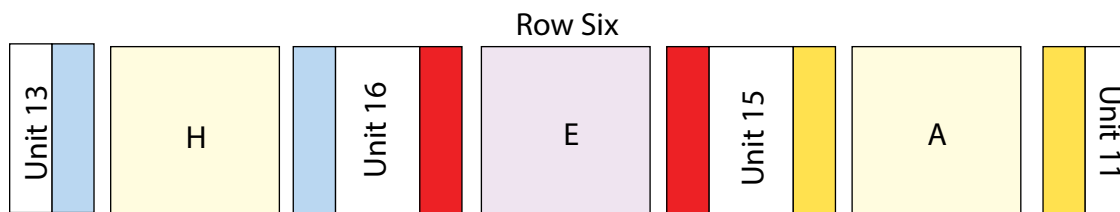

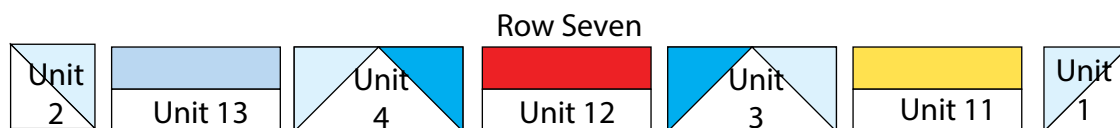
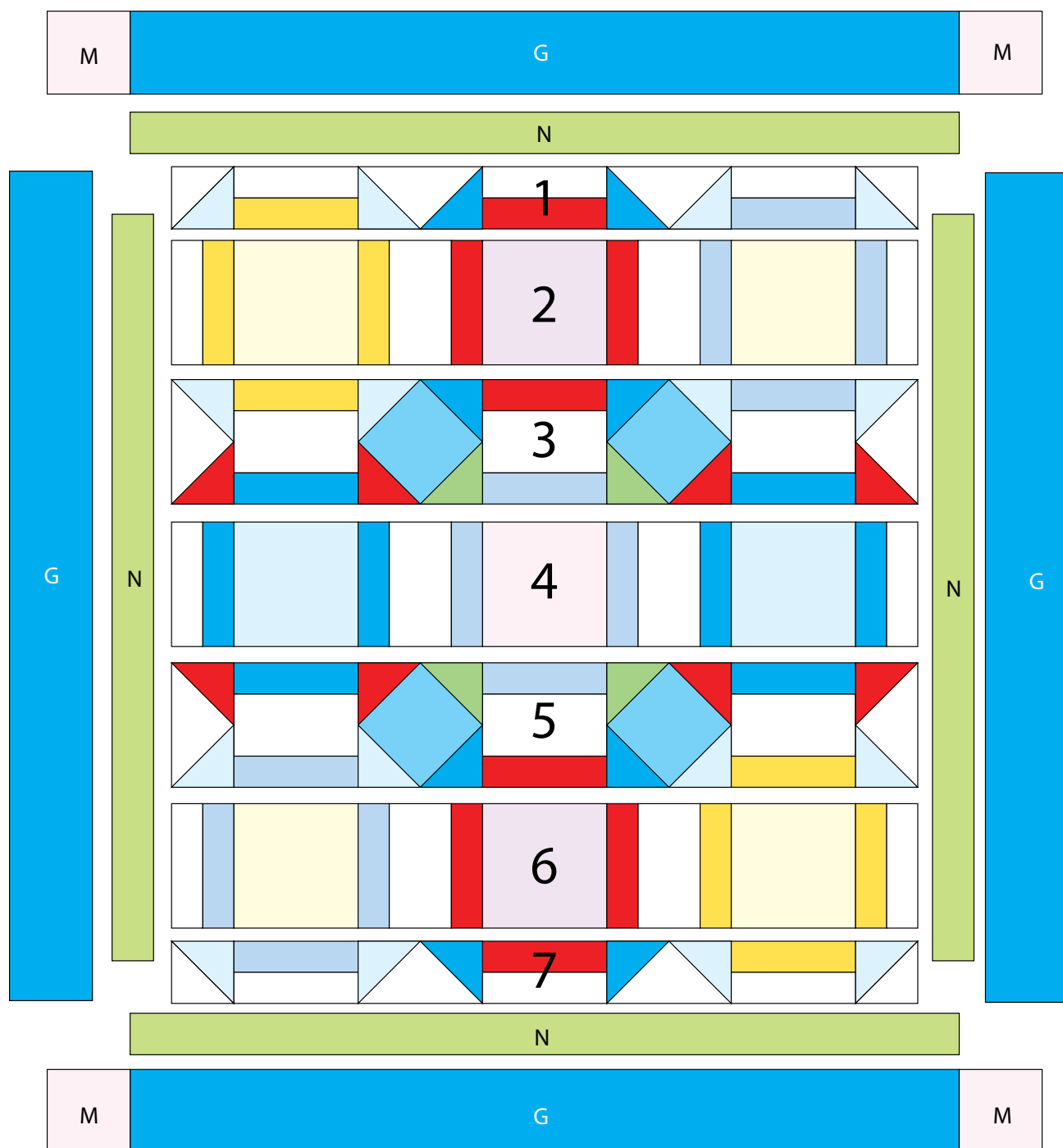
